7th Sunday after Pentecost Afterfeast of the Transfiguration Holy Martyr and Archdeacon Euplus of Catania

"Lord I Call..." Tone 6

Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! <u>Hear</u> me, O Lord! Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>cal</u>l upon You!// Hear me, O Lord!

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>incense</u>, and let the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice!// Hear <u>me</u>, O Lord!

V. (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name!

Tone 6 (for the Resurrection)

Possessing victory over <u>hell</u>, O Christ, since You are <u>free</u> among the dead, You as<u>cend</u>ed the Cross raising with Yourself those who sat in the <u>shades</u> of death.// Drawing life from Your light, O almighty Savior, have <u>mer</u>cy on us!

V. (9) The righteous will surround me, for You will deal bountifully with me.

Today Christ <u>tramples</u> on death, for He is <u>risen</u> as He said! Let us all <u>sing</u> this song, for He has granted <u>joy</u> to the world: O Light unapproachable, O Fountain of life!//

O Savior almighty, have mercy on us!

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

Where shall we sinners flee from You, Who are in all creation?

In heaven You dwell!

In hell You trampled on death!

In the <u>depths</u> of the sea?

Even there is Your hand, O Master!

To You we flee, and falling before You, we pray://

O You Who rose from the dead, have mercy on us!

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

(Resurrection stichera by Anatolius)

In Your Cross, we <u>glo</u>ry, O Christ. We sing and glorify Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion. For <u>You</u> are our God,// and we know no <u>oth</u>er than You.

V. **(6)** *If* You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

Tone 1 (for the Feast) (Joy of the Heavenly Hosts)

He, Who of <u>old</u>, spoke through images on Mount Sinai saying: "I am <u>He</u> Who Is,"

is today transfigured on Mount Tabor,

showing <u>forth</u> the Prototype, shining with rays of <u>splen</u>dor.//

Therefore, O Christ, I magnify Your <u>pow</u>er.

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

Taking with You Your favorite disciples, Peter, James, and John, O Christ,

You willingly led them up to the <u>mountain</u> and <u>showed</u> them an awesome <u>won</u>der: the everlasting and un<u>bear</u>able magnificence// of Your divine ar<u>ri</u>val from afar.

V. **(4)** From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

The A<u>pos</u>tles of old trembled at Your incomprehensible <u>coming</u>, O Christ.

They fell <u>down</u> on the ground and marveled at the power of Your di<u>vin</u>ity, for You shone <u>forth</u> more <u>bright</u>ly than the sun// with Your ineffable power, O <u>Good</u> One.

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

Tone 4 (for St. Euplus) (You have given a sign)

You crossed worthily the sea of <u>suffering</u>, your sail filled with the breath of the <u>Spirit</u>; you made your <u>way</u> to the calm haven of the <u>Kingdom</u> of God, where you received a rich re<u>ward</u> for your pains. And now you stand with the <u>Angels</u>, O <u>blessed</u> one,// before the Master of creation.

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

Clad in a purple robe dyed in your blood, O <u>glo</u>rious one, and crowned with the wreath of victory by the hand of the Cre<u>a</u>tor of life, you <u>dwell</u> in the heavens, reigning with the Com<u>pas</u>sionate One. Therefore, we call you <u>bless</u>ed, for you are a true martyr, a <u>ser</u>vant <u>of</u> the Word,// and the confir<u>ma</u>tion of the faith.

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

As a minister of the mysteries of the <u>Mas</u>ter, the wondrous Euplus brought himself forward like an <u>in</u>nocent lamb. He was be<u>head</u>ed with the sword, becoming a divine lamb and sweet-smelling sacrifice.

Therefore, we who love the martyrs call him <u>blessed</u>,// celebrating his hallowed suffering today in a holy <u>man</u>ner.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 4 (*for the Feast, by Cosmas the Monk*)

The mountain that once was veiled in <u>gloom</u> and smoke, is now <u>ho</u>ly and revered, since Your <u>feet</u>, O Lord, have stood up<u>on</u> it.

For by Your dread Transfigur<u>a</u>tion, the mystery hidden be<u>fore</u> the <u>ages</u> has been made manifest in the last times to Peter, <u>James</u>, and John.

Unable to endure the shining of Your face and the brilliance of Your <u>gar</u>ments, they fell to the <u>ground</u> upon their <u>faces</u>.

Seized with wonder and amazement, they saw Moses and E<u>lij</u>ah talking with You about the things that would be<u>fall</u> You; and a voice came in testimony from the <u>Fa</u>ther <u>say</u>ing:

"This is My beloved Son in Whom I am well pleased; <u>lis</u>ten to Him!//
It is He Who grants the world great <u>mercy!</u>"

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 6 (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

Who will not bless you, O most holy <u>Virgin?</u>
Who will not sing of your most pure <u>child</u>bearing?

The only-begotten Son shone timelessly from the <u>Fa</u>ther, but from you He was ineffably in<u>car</u>nate.

God by nature, yet <u>Man</u> for our sake, not two persons, but one known in two <u>na</u>tures.

Entreat Him, O pure and all-blessed <u>Lady</u>,// to have <u>mer</u>cy on our souls!

Litya

(If the rector desires the Litya, these stichera are sung)

Tone 2 (for the Feast) (O House of Ephratha)

Desiring to transform the nature of <u>Adam</u>, Christ now ascends Mount <u>Tabor</u>,// revealing His divinity to the di<u>sci</u>ples.

The thrice-radiant light of Your divine <u>glo</u>ry shone forth on Mount Tabor, O <u>Sav</u>ior,// illumining all things in the <u>u</u>niverse.

When the disciples beheld the beauty of Your <u>gar</u>ment and of Your whole <u>Body</u>, O Word,// they fell headlong upon the earth, singing Your <u>praises</u>.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

The voice of the <u>Fa</u>ther was heard from Heaven, <u>cry</u>ing out: "<u>This</u> is My be<u>lov</u>ed Son.// Hear Him, <u>all</u> of you!"

Aposticha

Tone 6 (for the Resurrection)

Your Resurrection, O Christ our <u>Sav</u>ior, the Angels in <u>heav</u>en sing! Enable <u>us</u> on earth// to glorify You in <u>pur</u>ity of heart!

V. The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!

Destroying the <u>gates</u> of hell, breaking the <u>chains</u> of death, You resurrected the fallen human race as al<u>mighty</u> God!// O Lord, Who rose from the dead, <u>glo</u>ry to You!

V. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved.

Desiring to return us to <u>Paradise</u>,
Christ was nailed to the Cross and <u>placed</u> in a tomb.
The Myrrhbearing Women sought Him with tears, <u>cry</u>ing,
"Woe to us, O <u>Sav</u>ior!
How do You deign to de<u>scend</u> to death?
What place can hold Your life bearing <u>body</u>?
Come to us as You <u>prom</u>ised!
Take away our <u>wail</u>ing and tears!"
Then the Angel appeared to them:
"Stop your lamen<u>tations!</u>
Go, proclaim to the A<u>pos</u>tles:
'The Lord is <u>risen</u>,//
granting us purification and great <u>mer</u>cy!'"

V. Holiness befits Your house, O Lord, forevermore!

Having been <u>cru</u>cified as You willed, by Your burial You captured <u>death</u>, O Christ, rising on the third day as God in <u>glo</u>ry,// granting the world unending life and great <u>mer</u>cy!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 4 (*for the Feast, by Cosmas the Monk*)

When You were transfigured upon a high mountain, O <u>Sav</u>ior, having with You the chief Dis<u>ci</u>ples, You shone <u>forth</u> in glorious <u>maj</u>esty, proving that those who excel in the height of their <u>vir</u>tues shall be made worthy of di<u>vine glory</u>.

Moses and Elijah, <u>talk</u>ing with Christ, showed that He is Lord of both the <u>liv</u>ing and the dead, the God Who spoke of old through the <u>Law</u> and the <u>Proph</u>ets. The voice of the Father testified to Him from the cloud of light, <u>say</u>ing: "Listen to Him, Who through the Cross has <u>despoiled</u> hell// and has given the dead e<u>ternal life!"</u>

(at Great Vespers)

Tone 6 Troparion (Resurrection)

The Angelic <u>Pow</u>ers were at Your tomb; the guards became as <u>dead</u> men.

Mary <u>stood</u> by Your grave, seeking Your most pure <u>body</u>.

You captured hell, not being <u>tempted</u> by it. You came to the Virgin, <u>granting</u> life.

O Giver of <u>Light</u>, <u>glo</u>ry to You!

(at Vigil)

Tone 4 Troparion to the Theotokos

Rejoice, O Virgin Theotokos,
Mary, full of grace, the <u>Lord</u> is with you!
Blessed are you among <u>wo</u>men,
and blessed is the <u>Fruit</u> of your womb,//
for you have borne the <u>Sav</u>ior of our souls. (twice)

Tone 7 Troparion (Feast)

You were trans<u>fig</u>ured on the mountain, O <u>Christ</u> God, revealing Your glory to Your Disciples as far as they could <u>bear</u> it. Let Your <u>ev</u>erlasting Light also shine upon us <u>sin</u>ners, through the prayers of the Theo<u>to</u>kos!//
O Giver of <u>Light</u>, glory to You! (once)

(at the Divine Liturgy)

Tone 6 Troparion (*Resurrection*)

The Angelic <u>Pow</u>ers were at Your tomb; the guards became as <u>dead</u> men.

Mary <u>stood</u> by Your grave, seeking Your most pure <u>body</u>.

You captured hell, not being <u>tempted</u> by it. You came to the Virgin, <u>granting</u> life.

O Lord, Who <u>rose</u> from the dead,// <u>glory</u> to You.

Tone 7 Troparion (Feast)

Tone 6 Kontakion (*Resurrection*)

When Christ God, the <u>Giv</u>er of Life, raised all of the dead from the valleys of misery with His <u>mighty</u> hand, He bestowed resurrection on the <u>hu</u>man race.//
He is the Savior of all, the Resurrection, the Life, and the <u>God</u> of all.

Tone 1 Kontakion (St. Euplus)

With the <u>love</u> of Christ as your <u>only</u> defense, you stood in the midst of your <u>^fight</u> and said: "I endure this struggle willingly and with <u>confidence!</u>" You rejoiced, O Euplus, to offer your <u>head</u> to the sword// and so you completed your course.

Tone 7 Kontakion (Feast)

On the <u>mountain</u> You were transfigured, O <u>Christ</u> God, and Your Disciples beheld Your glory as far as they could <u>see</u> it; so that when <u>they</u> would behold You <u>cru</u>cified, they would understand that Your suffering was <u>vol</u>untary, and would pro<u>claim</u> to the <u>world//</u> that You are truly the <u>Ra</u>diance of the <u>Fa</u>ther.

Tone 6 Prokeimenon (Resurrection)

O Lord, save Your people, / and bless Your inheritance! (Ps. 27:9a)

V. To You, O Lord, will I call. O my God, be not silent to me! (Ps. 27:1a)

Tone 4 Prokeimenon (Feast)

O Lord, how manifold are Your works; / in wisdom have You made them all. (*Ps.* 103:26)
