9th Sunday after Pentecost

Return of the Relics of the Apostle Bartholomew from Anastasiopolis to Lipari Holy Apostle Titus of the Seventy, Bishop of Crete

"Lord I Call..." Tone 8

Lord, I call upon You, hear me! Hear me, O Lord!
Lord, I call upon You, hear me!
Receive the voice of my prayer, when I call upon You!//
Hear me, O Lord!

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>incense</u>, and let the lifting <u>up</u> of <u>my</u> hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice!// Hear <u>me</u>, O Lord!

V. (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name!

Tone 8 *(for the Resurrection)*

We <u>offer</u> to <u>You</u>, O Christ, our evening song and reasonable <u>ser</u>vice, for You <u>willed</u> to have <u>mer</u>cy on us// by Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion.

V. (9) The righteous will surround me; for You will deal bountifully with me.

Lord, Lord, do not cast us a<u>way</u> from Your face! For You willed to have <u>mer</u>cy on us// by Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion.

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

Rejoice, O holy Zion:
Mother of the churches, the abode of God,
for you were the first to receive remission of sins//
by the Resurrection.

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

(Resurrection stichera by Anatolius)

The <u>Word</u> of God the <u>Fa</u>ther, begotten before the <u>ages</u>, in the latter times willed to be in<u>car</u>nate of the <u>Virgin</u> and endured cruci<u>fi</u>xion unto death. He has <u>saved</u> mortal man// by His Resur<u>rec</u>tion.

V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

Tone 4 (for St. Bartholomew) (As one valiant among the martyrs)

Let us fittingly bless the glorious Bartholomew: the sun of great splendor, the never-setting star; the living heaven declaring the glory of God, the divinely-inspired preacher of salvation and the beacon of nations, the river pouring forth streams of knowledge,// watering the hearts of the faithful.

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

Your travels were seen in the sea, O A<u>pos</u>tle, in a manner beyond human under<u>stand</u>ing, for, as your <u>rel</u>ics were thrown into the <u>wa</u>ters, they floated to the West, O highly-favored Bar<u>thol</u>omew, while noble martyrs from the East accompanied <u>you</u> with <u>hon</u>ors,//

as directed by the hand of the $\underline{\text{Mas}}$ ter of all.

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

Your relics sanctified the watery depths, O Apostle Bartholomew, as you miraculously directed them to the island of Lipari. where myrrh gushed forth from them, O glorious one, healing incurable passions.

Thus you saved those who dwelt there, becoming for them a refuge, deliverer and intercessor// before the King and Savior of all.

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

Tone 4 (for St. Titus) (You have given a sign)

You proclaimed the tri-personal <u>God</u>head, churning up the idolatrous sea of the <u>Gen</u>tiles.

You <u>res</u>cued those floundering in the depths of <u>god</u>lessness, bringing them into tranquil <u>har</u>bors.

You received the re<u>ward</u> of <u>heaven</u>,//
where you beseech the Lover of Man for those who sing your <u>praises</u>.

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

Your mind was illumined with divine brilliance, O godly <u>Ti</u>tus, as you journeyed with the di<u>vine</u> Paul.
You were a <u>ray</u> of the sun enlightening those in <u>darkness</u>.
With him you freed the whole earth from the <u>deepest</u> night.
Therefore we call you blessed, as a <u>God</u>-chosen <u>bish</u>op,// an inspired Apostle and most fervent inter<u>ces</u>sor.

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

Hailing from Crete and re<u>turn</u>ing there, you established the Faith as a firm foun<u>da</u>tion and <u>ed</u>ified the faithful by the divine power of <u>heav</u>en, O blessed Titus, first hierarch of your <u>home</u>land,// companion of Paul and the comfort of the <u>faithful</u>.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 1 (for St. Bartholomew)

O Apostle Bartholomew, you forsook the things of the earth and followed after Christ. Marked by the inspiration of the Holy Spirit you were sent by Him to perishing nations, converting people to the light of the knowledge of God. Completing the exploits of your godly suffering and enduring various tortures, you surrendered your soul to Christ. Entreat Him, O most blessed one,// that He may grant us great mercy!

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 8 (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

The <u>King</u> of heaven, because of His <u>love</u> for man, appeared on earth and <u>dwelt</u> with men. He took <u>flesh</u> from the pure <u>Virgin</u> and after assuming it, He came <u>forth</u> from her. The Son is one: in two natures, yet one <u>Per</u>son. Proclaiming Him as perfect <u>God</u> and <u>per</u>fect Man, we confess <u>Christ</u> our God!//
Entreat Him, O unwedded Mother, to have <u>mer</u>cy on our souls.

Aposticha

Tone 8 *(for the Resurrection)*

De<u>scending</u> from heaven to a<u>scend</u> the Cross, the eternal Life has <u>come</u> for death to raise <u>those</u> who are <u>fal</u>len; to enlighten those in <u>dark</u>ness.//
O Jesus, our Savior and illuminator, <u>glo</u>ry to You!

V. The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!

We <u>glorify</u> Christ, who <u>rose</u> from the dead. He accepted the human <u>body</u> and soul, and freed <u>both</u> from <u>suffering</u>. His most pure soul descended to <u>hell</u>, which He spoiled. His holy body did not see cor<u>rup</u>tion in the tomb.// He is the Re<u>deem</u>er of our souls.

V. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved.

In <u>psalms</u> and songs we glorify Your Resurrection from the <u>dead</u>, O Christ. By it, You have freed us from the <u>tor</u>tures of hell// and as God have granted eternal life and great <u>mer</u>cy.

V. Holiness befits Your house, O Lord, forevermore!

O<u>Mas</u>ter of all, incomprehensible Creator of <u>heav</u>en and earth, by Your suffering on the Cross You have gained <u>pas</u>sionlessness for me. Accepting burial and a<u>rising</u> in glory, You resurrected Adam with Yourself by Your al<u>mighty</u> hand. Glory to Your rising on the <u>third</u> day! By it You have granted us eternal <u>life</u> and <u>cleansing</u> of sins// as the only com<u>pas</u>sionate One.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 8 (*Theotokion*)

O un<u>wed</u>ded <u>Virgin</u>, who ineffably conceived <u>God</u> in the flesh, O <u>Mother of God</u> most high, accept the cries of your servants, O <u>blame</u>less One! Grant cleansing of trans<u>gres</u>sions to all!// Receive our prayers and pray to <u>save</u> our souls!

(at Great Vespers)

Tone 8 Troparion (*Resurrection*)

You descended <u>from</u> on <u>high</u>, O <u>Mer</u>ciful One! You accepted the <u>three</u> day <u>bur</u>ial to free us from our <u>suf</u>ferings!// O Lord, our <u>Life</u> and Resur<u>rec</u>tion, <u>glo</u>ry to You!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit,

Tone 3 Troparion (Apostles)

Holy A<u>pos</u>tles Bartholomew and <u>Ti</u>tus, entreat the <u>mer</u>ciful God,// to grant our <u>souls</u> for<u>give</u>ness of trans<u>gres</u>sions!

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 3 Resurrectional Dismissal Theotokion

We praise you as the mediatrix of our sal<u>va</u>tion, O Virgin Theo<u>to</u>kos.

For your Son, our God, Who took <u>flesh</u> from you, accepted the <u>Passion</u> on the Cross,// delivering us from corr<u>up</u>tion as the <u>Lov</u>er of Man.

(at Vigil)

Tone 4 Troparion to the Theotokos

Rejoice, O Virgin Theo<u>to</u>kos, Mary, full of grace, the <u>Lord</u> is with you! Blessed are you among <u>wo</u>men, and blessed is the <u>Fruit</u> of your womb,// for you have borne the <u>Sav</u>ior of our souls. *(thrice)*

(at the Divine Liturgy)

Tone 8 Troparion (Resurrection)

You descended <u>from</u> on <u>high</u>, O <u>Mer</u>ciful One! You accepted the <u>three</u> day <u>bur</u>ial to free us from our <u>suf</u>ferings!// O Lord, our <u>Life</u> and Resur<u>rec</u>tion, <u>glo</u>ry to You!

Tone 3 Troparion (Apostles)

Holy Apostles Bartholomew and <u>Ti</u>tus, entreat the <u>mer</u>ciful God,// to grant our <u>souls</u> forgiveness of transgressions!

Tone 8 Kontakion (Resurrection)

By rising <u>from</u> the <u>tomb</u>, You raised the dead and resurrected <u>Adam</u>. Eve exults <u>in</u> Your <u>Resurrection</u>,// and the world <u>cel</u>ebrates Your <u>ris</u>ing from the dead, O greatly <u>Mer</u>ciful One!

Tone 4 Kontakion (St. Bartholomew)

You have appeared to the universe as a <u>great</u> sun, shining with the radiance of thy teachings and awesome <u>mir</u>acles.//
You enlighten those who honor you, O Apostle of the Lord, Bar<u>thol</u>omew.

Tone 2 Kontakion (St. Titus)

<u>Ti</u>tus, worthy of all praise and preacher of Christ's <u>mys</u>teries, you were Paul's companion, and with him taught us the <u>doc</u>trine of God. <u>There</u>fore we cry <u>out</u> to you://
"Never cease to inter<u>cede</u> for the <u>sake</u> of us all!"

Tone 8 Prokeimenon (Resurrection)

Pray and make your vows / before the Lord, our God! (Ps. 75:10a)

V. In Judah God is known; His Name is great in Israel. (Ps. 75:1)
